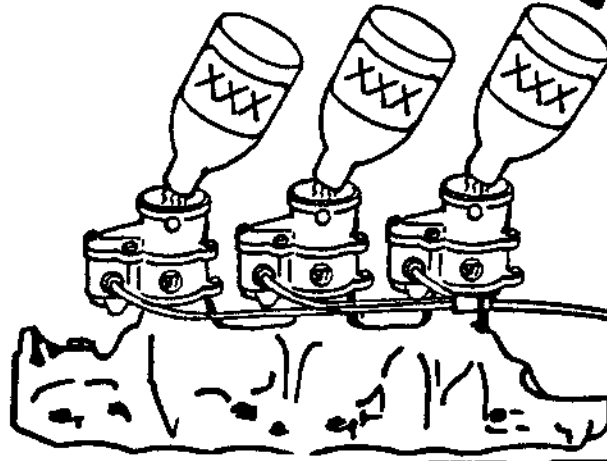

BY-LAWS AND MEMBERSHIP OF JUGGERS RACING TEAM

ARTICLE 1 NAME AND INSIGNIA

- Sec. 1. The name of this club shall be known as:  
JUGGERS RACING TEAM, INC.
- Sec. 2. The insignia of this club shall be a tri-carbureated automotive intake manifold, with a gas bottle (jug) over each carbureator at an angle, with the words JUGGERS in an arch centered above, and the words RACING TEAM centered below in block lettering.
- Sec. 3. The color of the lettering will be gold, with a black background.

ARTICLE 11 OBJECTIVES

- Sec. 1. To promote interest in various types of automobile activities, including construction and racing.
- Sec. 2. To create good fellowship and sportsmanship among the members
- Sec. 3. To uphold the principals of good government.
- Sec. 4. To conduct club operations and activities in such a manner as to bring about a clearer understanding on the part of the public, press, law enforcement agencies, and of organized street rod activities as well as recognized racing organizations.
- Sec. 5. To promote safety in automobile construction, maintenance and operation.

ARTICLE 111 MEMBERSHIP

- Sec. 1. There shall be three types of membership in this club:  
A. Active  
B. Associate  
C. Honorary
- Sec. 2. Active: Any person of good standing and character interested in street rod and racing activities.
- Sec. 3. All members shall try to maintain a running car while active, and shall try to maintain it to suitable standards of the club. Notification shall be made by mail if a member terminates his membership.
- Sec. 4. Associate: Any member who lives outside of the immediate Bay Area. They must attend at least One meeting a year. They must pay all regular dues, and obey all rules and By-laws, as if they were active members.

MEMBERSHIP (continued)

- Sec. 5. HONORARY:  
Proposed honorary members, who have been a great asset to the club, shall be accepted only by 100% vote of the entire active membership.
- Sec. 6. Prospective members must be sponsored by an active member of the club. The prospective member shall attend two meetings within four months, bring his car to one scheduled club event, and his car shall be subject to a safety inspection prior to the acceptance by the vote of the present membership, which is not to exceed three no votes.
- Sec. 7. Upon written request and acceptance, members who enter the Armed Forces are exempt from all dues and/or fines.
- Sec. 8. New members must try to maintain a running club approved car for One full year after obtaining active membership.
- Sec. 9. Any member dropping out of the organization shall be required to return his club plaque to the club, at which time the purchased price of the plaque shall be refunded.
- Sec. 10. Club members shall be required to attend meetings regardless of the status of their car.

ARTICLE IV

INITIATION FEES AND DUES

- Sec. 1. The dues for active members shall be \$48.00 per year, and \$24.00 for associates, and shall be payable to the club treasurer on or before the first day of April.
- Sec. 2. Any member whose dues are in arrears three months shall be automatically suspended from membership, and can be reinstated to full membership only upon payment of all delinquent dues.

ARTICLE V

OFFICERS

- Sec. 1. The elective officers of this club shall be a President, Vice-President, Secretary, Treasurer, and Sgt-at-Arms. In addition, there shall be one member of the club, other than an officer, who will meet with the officers and together will constitute a Board of Directors.
- Sec. 2. A majority of the Board of Directors shall constitute a quorum at any meeting of the Board.

ARTICLE VI

ELECTIONS

- Sec. 1. All nominees for office shall be active members in good standing.

ELECTION (continued)

- Sec. 2. All elected and appointed officers and Board members must remain active members in good standing during their terms of office.
- Sec. 3. All officers and directors shall be elected at the last meeting prior to the beginning of the new term and shall assume office at the first regular meeting of the new term, and shall hold office for Two years or until their successors are duly elected and qualified.
- Sec. 4. Nominations shall be made from the floor and all voting shall be by secret ballot, or majority vote of all present membership.
- Sec. 5. Nominations and elections of the members of the Board of Directors shall take place after the election of the Officers.
- Sec. 6. Elections shall be decided by the majority vote of all active members in good standing.

ARTICLE VII

DUTIES OF OFFICERS

- Sec. 1. The President shall preside at all meetings of the club; appoint such committees as necessary to carry out the activities of the club; serve as Ex-Officio member of all committees; issue the call for regular and special Board meetings; see that regular elections are held in accordance with the club's Constitution; and carry out the directives of the Board of Directors.
- Sec. 2. The Vice-President shall perform the duties of the President in his absence.
- Sec. 3. The Secretary shall keep the minutes of the meetings of the club; keep membership records; give notice of all regular and special meetings of the membership and the Board of Directors; handle club correspondence; and keep custody of all records of the club.
- Sec. 4. The Treasurer shall collect dues; collect all other money due the club; keep the club books; make payments from club funds when so ordered by the Board of Directors; shall countersign all club checks; and shall make regular reports of the financial condition of the club to the Board.
- Sec. 5. The Sgt-at-Arms shall maintain order at all meetings so as not to disrupt any of the proceedings.

DUTIES OF OFFICERS (continued)

- Sec. 6. The Board of Directors shall constitute the Executive Board of the club, and shall be responsible for the execution, through its officers, of the authorized policies of the club; authorize all expenditures of club funds; determine club policy; shall, by majority vote fill vacancies in any office and in the Board of Directors; and shall submit to the club in regular meetings; recommendations which it has approved affecting the policies of this club.

ARTICLE VIII

MEETINGS

- Sec. 1. A majority of the active members in good standing shall constitute a quorum.
- Sec. 2. Regular membership meetings shall be held once a month at a time and place set by the Board of Directors.
- Sec. 3. Meetings of the Board shall be held every month at a time and place set by the Board.
- Sec. 4. The President may call special Board meetings and special membership meetings.
- Sec. 5. Roberts Rules of Order shall govern the parliamentary proceedings of the club, unless otherwise provided by these By-Laws.
- Sec. 6. The order of business for all meetings of the club and Board of Directors shall be as follows:
- A. Call to Order
  - B. Roll Call
  - C. Introduction of any visitors
  - D. Reading and approval of minutes of previous meeting
  - E. Reading of any correspondence
  - F. Report of the Secretary
  - G. Report of the Treasurer
  - H. Report of any Committees
  - I. Old Business
  - J. New Business
  - K. Announcements
  - L. Adjournment
- Sec. 7. The standing committees of the club are:
- A. Membership
  - B. Activities
  - C. Entertainment
  - D. Safety
  - E. Public relations

ARTICLE IX SAFETY CHECK

- Sec. 1. Every member's car shall be given an equipment and safety check at least once a year, with a follow up inspection for those who are found unsatisfactory.

ARTICLE X DELEGATIONS

- Sec. 1. Delegations shall be appointed by the President, subject to the approval of the Board, to represent this club at any convention, meeting or assembly as may be deemed necessary. Such delegations shall exercise only those powers specifically vested in them by the Board.

ARTICLE XI AMENDMENTS

- Sec. 1. This Constitution and By-Laws can be amended at any regular or special meeting of the membership at which there is a quorum, by a two-thirds majority of all active members in good standing present, provided the Board has previously approved the merits of the proposed amendment. After Board approval, written notice must be given to each member at least one week before the proposed amendment is voted upon.
- Sec. 2. Amendments so adopted shall take effect immediately.


ARTICLE XII RELEASE OF APPLICANT
